The coins are easily identifiable with monochrome pictures of front and back. Periodically there is an explanation paragraph. Probably due to limited space many coins are omitted. For the most part it is a catalog.

A fully-illustrated catalog and price list of U.S. coins, 1616 to 1966, including a brief history of American coinage, early American coins and tokens, early Mint issues, private and state gold and silver commemoratives, and quantities struck. Yes, the market prices are out of date but the basic information and photos are as valuable today as when the book was printed in 1967. Outstanding reference material!
