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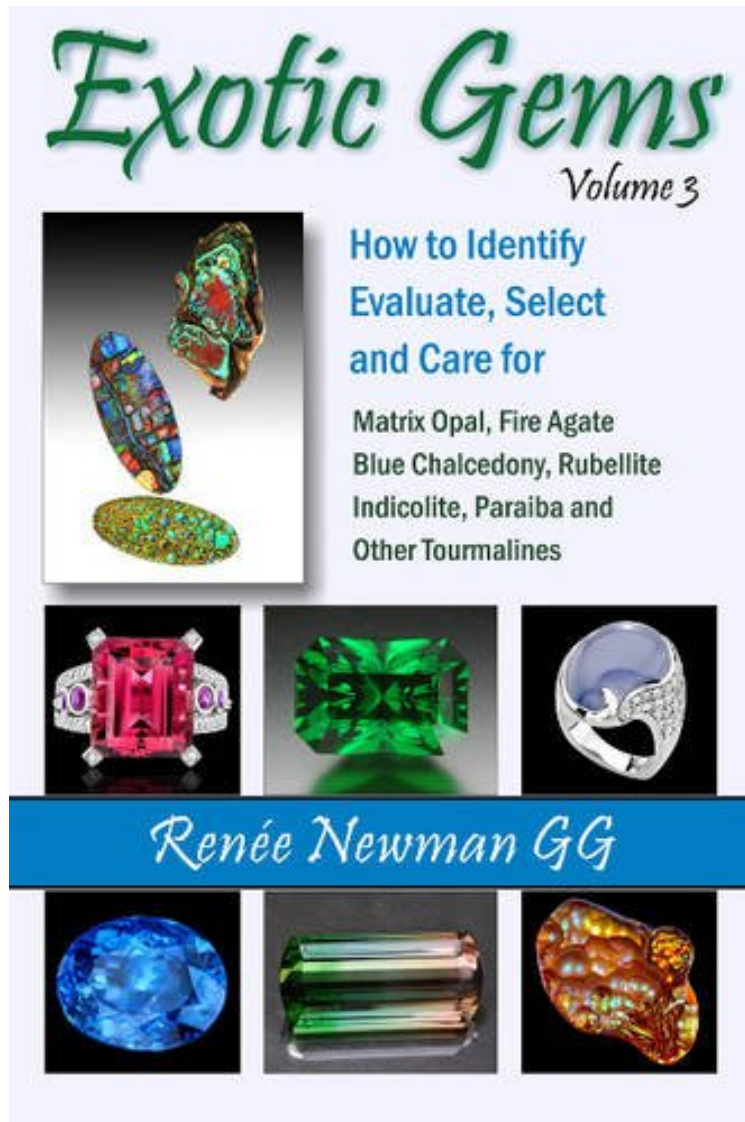

These books seem to have the most basic information in them. I have loads of gem books and have held positions in several Gem and Mineral Societies. I have studied gems and minerals and find this book too basic for what it is. It should have some expert knowledge in them that can be shared. I purchased all three of them so I can grow my knowledge and share with others but there is almost nothing in them that isn't common knowledge. For instance, when choosing blue chalcedony the more intense/pure the color and the more clean the stone the more quality it is -- no kidding! It does mention that banding (such as blue lace) is of less value than the pure color unless the blue lace is of exceptional patterning. Sounds all subjective to me. Don't waste your money, just attend a couple of rock and gem shows (not bead shows) and ask the pricing for different items. You'll quickly find how gems are valued and what makes something exotic or valuable.
