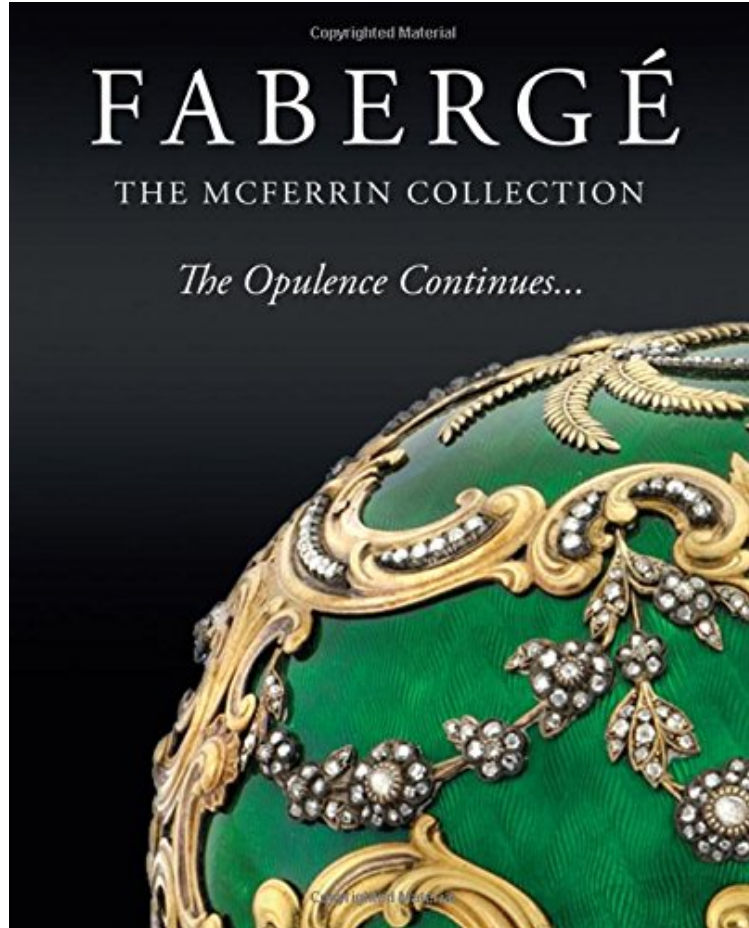

I've seen the exhibit and I've read the book and I couldn't be more impressed. The McFerrins have done a thorough job of detailing the provenance of each piece. And with over 600 pieces, that's a lot of research! The first book, From a Snowflake to an Iceberg had the first 300 pieces, and this one wraps up the collection with 300 more pieces they've purchased over the last 3 years. If you haven't read the book, you need to. And if you haven't seen the exhibit at HMNS, you're missing out!

Faberg is renowned for his Imperial Easter eggs designed for the Tsar of Russia one of which appears in The McFerrin Collection, the 1892 Diamond Trellis Egg, and is illustrated in this book. The comprehensive index includes an image and Houston Museum of Natural Science item number for each piece in the over 600 item collection a wonderful resource for Faberg experts and enthusiasts alike. A fold-out family tree illustrates the branches of the Imperial Russian family with indication of related items in The McFerrin Collection. This book celebrates The McFerrin Collection of Faberg masterpieces and reveals items that have never been published before. Also highlighted are a selection of important Imperial Russian pieces that appeared in the first book on the collection, *From a Snowflake to an Iceberg: The McFerrin Collection* (2013), along with a few of the collectors' personal favorites. As the preferred jeweler to the Russian Tsars and European royalty at the turn of the 20th century, Peter Carl Faberg (1846-1920) created an array of objets d'art that exude both opulence and innovation, and tell of a period in history likely never to be repeated. The McFerrin Collection has become one of the largest privately owned Faberg collections in the world, and is on long-term loan to the Houston Museum of Natural Science in Texas.
