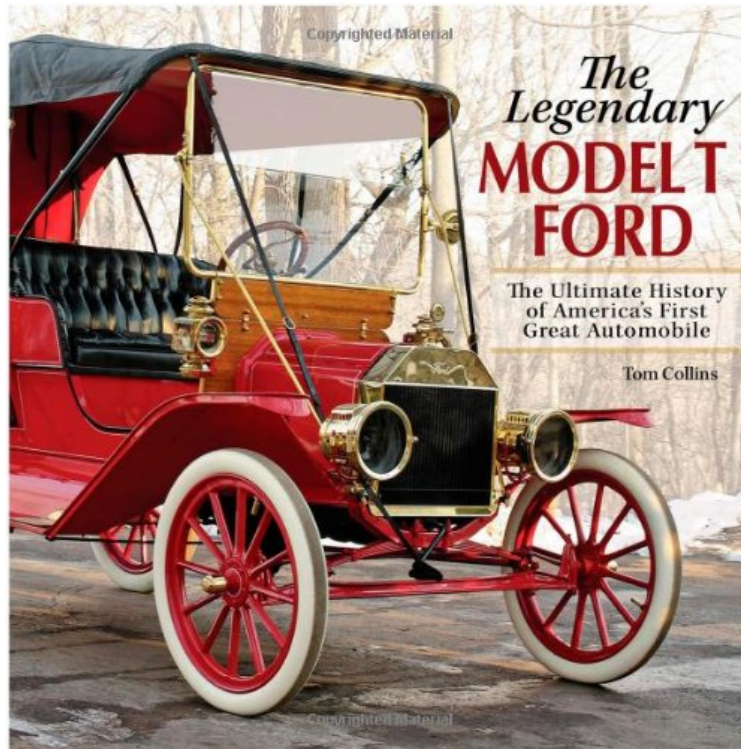

The pages are filled with large clear excellent photographs in both black white as well as color. The reproduction is outstanding for almost every photo in the book. The printing is on a glossier brighter white paper than really makes the photos pop. The enjoyable text is in a larger font than I'm used to seeing in books like this. It's actually refreshing to see the publisher use such an easy to read font. I found the writing to be enjoyable and an easy read.
