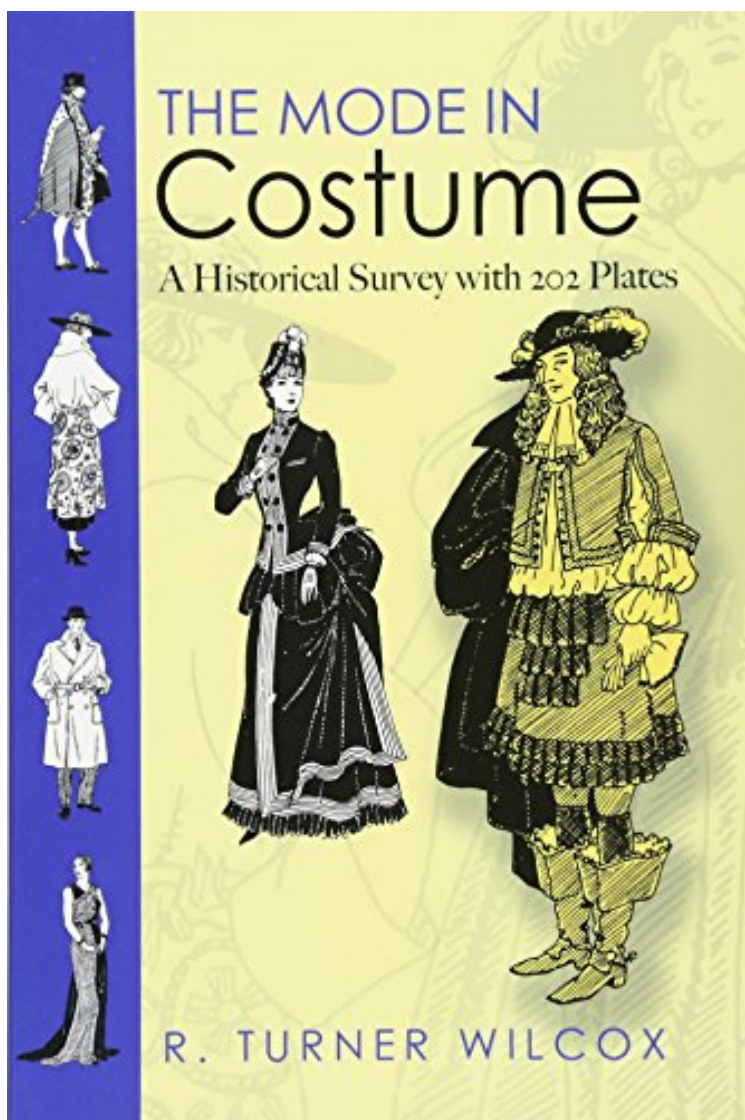

It's simply the best basic costume book out there. The images are b/w, precise line drawings, usually based on portraits, that allow one to see how the garment is constructed w/o the distraction of color, personality, etc. The text portion is unique to this book extremely useful. Each era has the distinct garments, accessories, fabrics, colors listed with a brief description of what remained the same, the changes, the innovations.
