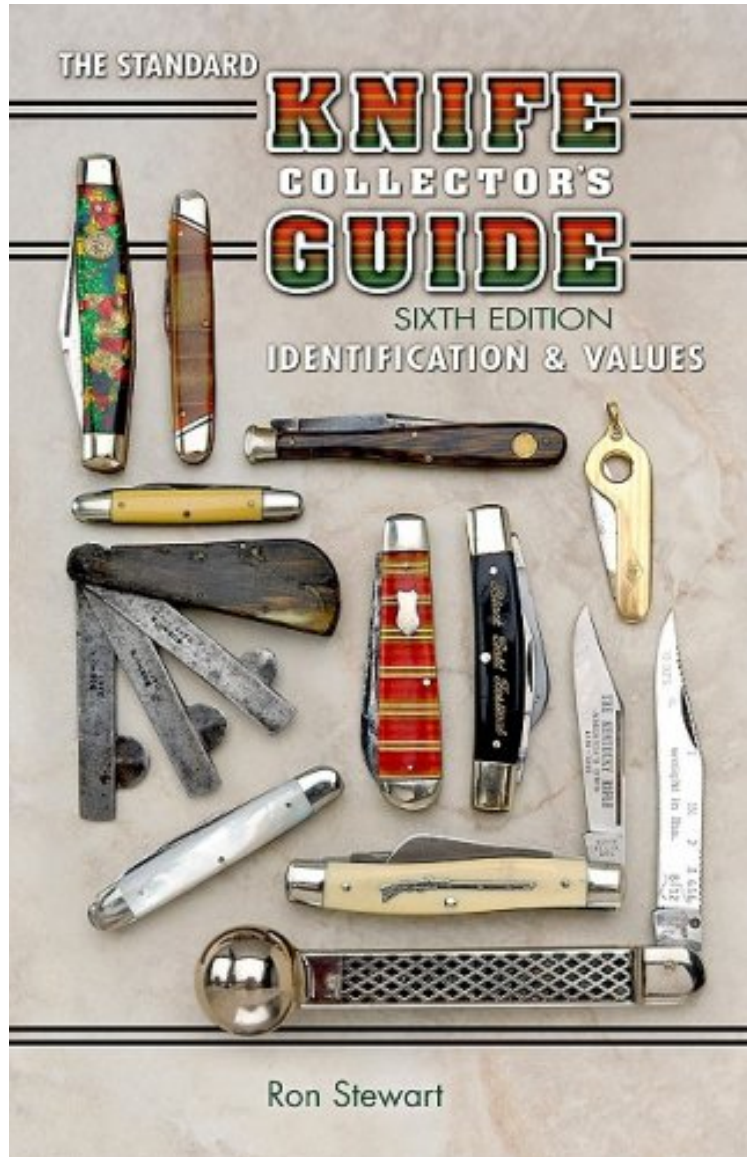

price value of a knife. This author has composed a table for chosen makes and models, followed by other tables for other details. Finally, a table to rate the condition -- which produces an estimated reasonable price for the knife. I find the first table is inadequate for any knife I presently own, by identity of the brand or comparable model, therefore all following evaluation is irrelevant. The book has no index for any section or any specific / type of knife, The book does have a section of some manufacturers and some of their current productions, but again -- I have found no listing of any knife I presently own (many of my collection are out of production - but commonly popular in general circulation). 0 of
